## Abstract

The Abstract should be no more than 250 words and consist of four sections labeled Background, Methods, Results and Conclusions. They should briefly describe the problem being addressed in the study, how the study was performed, the salient results and what conclusions can be made from the results.

**Keywords:** Three to ten keywords should be added to the end of the Abstract.

## I. Introduction

This document is a template for papers submitted to International Journal of Information Technology. If your paper is intended to this journal, please observe this format. Do not change the fonts or line spacing to squeeze more text into a limited number of pages.

## II. Format Requirement

### A. *Paper length and Font*

Publication-ready files must be written in English and be prepared using PDF and MS-WORD. (PDF is required; the MS-WORD format as an editable and backup version is only used in urgent

condition.) The papers should be no longer than 30 double-spaced pages (12-point font) including figures. The Final version should use single space.

#### *B. Title*

The title should be short and specific. Subtitles may be used to amplify the main title.

#### *C. Figures and Tables*

Tables and illustrations should be numbered consecutively in Arabic numerals. The position of each table and illustration in the text should be indicated.

#### *D. Abbreviations*

Words to be abbreviated should be spelt out in full the first time they appear in the text with the abbreviations in brackets. Thereafter the abbreviation should be used.

#### *E. References*

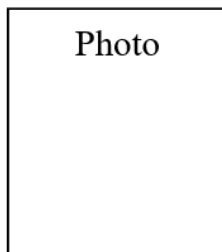
Authors are responsible for the accuracy and completeness of the content including the reference lists. Number citations consecutively in square brackets [1, 2]. The sentence punctuation follows the brackets. Numbered references should appear at the end of the article and should consist of the surnames and initials of authors, title of article, name of journal, year, volume, first and last page numbers.

### **III. Conclusion**

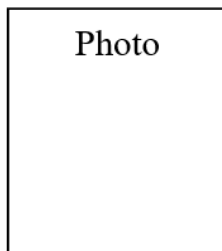

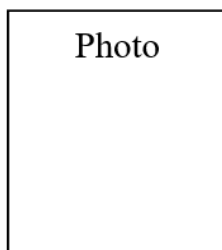
